COUNCIL NOTES

At the last Council meeting, projects for 2021 were reviewed. There aren't many construction projects anticipated, some road surfacing and the water meter changes. We'll have to accumulate some grant funding before the next major project can be considered.

ATCO will be changing all the street lights from High Pressure Sodium lights to LED lights early in the summer.

WATER RATES WILL BE CHANGING on your next bill. Our water is treated by EPCOR, and it is piped here through pipes owned by water commissions. The new rate will be \$4.375 /cubic meter (\$0.109 increase).

COVID-19 PANDEMIC EFFECT ON VILNA

To date, in Canada 619,000 people have had COVID. In Alberta 106,378 people have had it (that's 2.4 people in every 100 that have had it), and 13,839 are active cases. 47 of those are in Smoky Lake region and 75 are in the St. Paul region.

Another Alberta statistics that scares me is that in Ages 20-60 years – 66% of the cases with 50 deaths 61-80 plus years – 15% of the cases with 1,117 deaths **DON'T TELL ME IT'S NOT REAL.**

It won't go away unless we continue to

- wear a mask &
- keep more than 2 meters away from people
- and wash our hands
- and use hand sanitizers often. *And above all*:
- stay at home unless absolutely necessary.
- AND if you feel sick isolate yourself.
