We had a bit of vandalism and graffiti in the Village last month, but I want to thank the kid(s) and their parents for cleaning it up. *Lesson Learned*.

I understand that there have been a few burglaries and thefts. Make sure your property is well secured. The police recommend that you keep your yard well lighted and everything locked up when you're not around.

Thank you, also, for understanding about the necessity to initiate the Boil Water Order when we had the water line break. It's not anything anyone wants but it is necessary when the water is completely shut off because there is always a change for backflow to get into the pipes and contaminate the whole water system. We were fortunate, all the water sample tests came back clean.

<u>URGENT!!</u> – If you are flushing: Rubber Gloves, Diapers, <u>Baby/Hygiene wipes</u>, Condoms, Feminine Hygiene Products, Kleenex, Paper Towel, Grease, or any other thing that is not intended to be flushed into the Sewer lines you may suffer the consequences by *backing up your sewer line into your home, plugging the sewer lines and lift pumps or breaking underground piping that may cost thousands of dollars, cause a loss of sewer services to the Village resulting in paying more for sewer disposal utilities.*

LAND USE BYLAW ...

Attached is a letter indicating that the Village is preparing a new <u>Land Use Bylaw</u>. The existing Bylaw was passed in 1998 and has at least 18 amendments



since. It was decided that an update was in order.

 The Land Use Bylaw establishes rules and regulations for land development as well as the process of making decisions for development permit applications.

- The Land Use Bylaw includes land use districts (zones) such as the R1 – Residential, C-Commercial, or M-Light Industrial, as well as zoning for Institutional Development such as schools, lodges, health centres and cultural development.
- Each land use district (zone) has certain land uses that are permitted outright, others are conditional upon approval, and some are prohibited. Examples of land uses include a detached dwelling, merchandise sale, a restaurant or manufacturing.

Here are some of the regulations included in a Land Use Bylaw.

- Accessory building (e.g. garage or shed) height, size, placement, exterior design, etc.
- Land use district (zone) for a parcel of land e.g. residential, commercial, industrial, etc.
- Main building type, size, placement, height, elevation design, etc.
- Parking and landscaping requirements
- Permitted and discretionary uses e.g. residence, business, recreation, park, etc.
- Applications which are exempt from requiring a development permit application
- Sign and fence regulations, etc.
