September and October seemed to zip right past us. Your Council has been in place for a year.

Your Council has met with representatives from NE MuniCorr which is the Municipally owned property that used to be the railway property. For more than 20 years it has provided recreation to those who enjoy snowmobiles and ATV's. It's closed to ATV's from January 1 to March 31, to keep the snow groomed for snowmobiles.

They also met with Aspen View School representatives, including our new Principal Joe Harrington and Board member Donna Cherniwchan. The discussion >>> about how the Village can become more involved in the School and how the School can become more involved with the Village.
